Melodieuse beanie. From newborn to adults

(designed by Sabrina Bourgoin)





Materials:

- 100 g of Picasso Chunky, or any Chunky yarn
- 6 mm Crochet hook

Abbreviations : ML – Magic loop

Ch – Chain

HTC – Half treble crochet

TC - Treble crochet

<u>Instructions</u> (for adult size, for the other sizes, scroll down).

Start with Magic Loop (or Ch 3 and join, then work the stitches in the loop formed by Ch3).

Round 1 – Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), work 12 HTC in ML and join. (12 HTC). Tighten ML, tie a knot, weave in end. This is the **RIGHT SIDE**.

<u>Note</u> – From now on, work in back loops of every stitch, this will form a pattern.

Round 2 – Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch now, and for the remainder of the hat). Work 2 HTC in each stitch around, join. (24 HTC).

Round 3 – Ch 1, work (2 HTC in next st, 1 HTC in next st) all the way around, join (36HTC).

Round 4 – Ch 1, work (2 HTC in next st, 1 HTC in next 2 sts) all the way around, join (48 HTC).

Round 5 – Ch 1, work a HTC in each st around, join. (48 HTC).

Round 6 – Ch 1, work (2 HTC in next st, 1 HTC in next 3 sts) all the way around, join (60 HTC).

Round 7 – Ch 1, work a HTC in each st around, join (60 HTC).

Round 8 – Ch 1, work (2 HTC in next st, 1 HTC in next 4 sts) all the way around, join (72 HTC).

Rounds 9 to 18 - Ch 1, work a HTC in each st around, join (72 HTC).

Round 19 (Optional – doesn't have to be done, but if you want your hat a tiny bit longer, do round 19) - Ch 1, work a HTC in each st around, join (72 HTC).

Note – I stitched Round 19, so if this rounded was opted out, the hat would be slightly shorter).

Turn hat, so **WRONG SIDE** is now facing.

Round 20 to 23 - Ch 1, work a HTC in each st around, join (72 HTC).

Round 24 (Edging) – (Ch 2, 2 TC in the same stitch on which Ch 2 stands, skip 2 stitches, slip stitch in next stitch) all the way around, join and Fasten Off the yarn. Weave in ends.

Flip over Round 20 to 24 over, so the edging is on the same side as the RIGHT SIDE of the hat.

Newborns

For the crown, work first 5 rounds of hat.

Baby - 3 to 6 months

For the crown, work first 6 rounds of hat.

Baby - 6 to 12 months

For the crown, work first 7 rounds of hat.

Toddler - preschooler (12 months - 3 years)

For the crown, work first 7 rounds of hat.

Child (3 - 10 years)

For the crown, work first 8 rounds of hat.

For the rest of the hat, in all sizes, after all the increase rounds are done, make the hat for as long as you want it, keep measuring on the head, then turn the hat, so **WRONG SIDE** is now facing, and work in pattern, but perhaps do a few rows less, so for example, for a newborn I would make it a couple of rounds shorter, and then add the edging. I hope the explanations are good enough, if not, email me, I will only be too happy to help.

Crochet hat sizing guidelines

To work out how to make the crown of a hat, there are 2 simple formulas.Let's try and make a newborn baby hat.

As we are working the crown in rounds, the diameter grows, but how do you know when to stop, when is it big enough?

If the diameter of our circle measures 4 inches (10 cms), then we do this simple formula: $4 \times 3.14 = 12.5$ inches ($10 \times 3.14 = 31.4$ cms), so this gives us the circumference of the hat of 12.5 inches (31.4 cms), which reaches the newborn size. At this point, stop the increases, and carry working on the body of the hat, until desired length.

Now, let's say, if you wanted to make a newborn baby hat, and only knew the hat circumference size, how do you work out how big to make the crown, then we reverse the formula, so it would be : $12.5 \div 3.14 = 4$ inches $(31.4 \div 3.14 = 10 \text{ cms})$.

I hope that has helped. I am inserting 2 tables of all sizes of hats, along with how big the hat crown diameter should be, the hat height, etc, from premie sizes all the way up to adult sizes.
